From the Pastor

On June 5, we will move into the Season of the church known as Pentecost. We call this the 'birth day' of the church. It is the day the Spirit of God came upon the disciples and literally pushed them out into the streets to witness to God's love for all people. On this 'birth day' our celebration will include red balloons, red candles, and hopefully you, dressed in your red!

As I write these words of celebration, I am deeply distressed and saddened by yet another mass shooting, this one taking the lives of 19 elementary students and two teachers. Today It is difficult to feel joyful.

Like you I am praying for the families who lost their children and loved ones. I am praying that God will wake up our senators who refuse to take a stand for more gun control in our country.

I am praying that people will wake up and vote out of office those who refuse to support universal background checks and the ban of assault weapons.

At a recent Wednesday morning Meditation Group meeting on Zoom, we shared our grief over all the lives taken in the last few weeks due to gun violence. These were people just going about their lives, doing the ordinary things we do, like grocery shopping, worshiping in church, and going to school. This reality is stark.

But eventually we came back to the truth of the Gospel message - Hope. We are people of hope. We never give up. We turn to God, and to each other, for comfort and strength

The Spirit of God that blew through the upper room on that first Pentecost is the God of hope and new life. It is a Spirit of God that will not cease working to bring peace and comfort to those who are brokenhearted this day.

It is the life-giving Spirit of God that continues to give voice to the Church of Jesus Christ, as we stand up, speak out, and share the message of justice and hope.

Connecting and Healing Through Laughter by Micah Rose Emerson

It feels strange. It's been three years since I woke up to the news that my mother had ... passed away. ... My life with her sped through my mind. My first day of school. My seventh birthday. Fights about cleaning my bedroom ... and being late for school. In the days, weeks, and years that have passed, I have experienced grief. No one tells you that grief is more than just crying or being sad all the time. Grief, in my case, included lots and lots of stories that made me laugh. My mother was hilarious. She and I would often stay up late watching a rerun of some show from some bygone era and just

laugh. She and my father were quicker to tell a joke than fuss at us when we got in trouble for doing something that we clearly didn't think through. ... We know that God is with us in the painful, desperate hours and in the joyous moments of our lives. We must remember that grief looks and sounds different for everyone, but that God is here, whether we even notice Her. Sometimes, late in the midnight hour (as some of the church ladies used to say), I will remember a story about my mom that brings a smile to my lips. In those moments I laugh, knowing that God and my mother are with me, here and now.

The Sakuma Scholarship Fund

The Sakuma Scholarship Fund was established in 2022 as a memorial to Mr. Tad Sakuma, an Elder and Deacon at the Sturge Memorial Presbyterian Church in San Mateo who lived his life in faithful discipleship to his Lord, Jesus Christ.

He also left his legacy in the hands of the congregation he loved, and so this Fund is meant to make his witness into the future.

Tad was born in San Mateo on December 28, 1918 and except for living in Japan for two years and three years in Utah during World War II, he lived his entire 101 years in San Mateo. After returning to San Mateo from the Topaz Japanese Internment Camp in 1945, Tad became involved in the San Mateo Japanese Christian community and was an original member who helped start Sturge Presbyterian Church in the early 1950s. During his 70 years of service to the Lord, he humbly served at Sturge Presbyterian Church in many positions: Elder, Deacon, facilities committee, Treasurer, and Sunday School teacher. Galatians 5:22 describes the "Fruit of the Spirit" and Tad embodied all of these qualities: love, joy, peace, patience, forgiveness, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. Tad's life serves as an example to us all as how we humble ourselves and serve the Lord we become more and more like Jesus.

The purpose of the Fund is to provide help to students to continue their education and to achieve their dreams for life and vocation. While a church membership is not required to apply, we hope that those who receive a scholarship will recognize that the gift demonstrates God's love for the applicant and is a witness to Christ's desire that we have abundant lives.

There are no specific criteria for receiving a scholarship, but the goals described by the applicant will have heavy weight in the decision of the Committee.

The deadline on the application is firm. No material postmarked, hand delivered, or received by email after that date will be considered.

One further thought: If a successful applicant achieves their goals, we invite them to consider making a donation to the Fund to help another student achieve a personal or vocational goal.
