was honored by the mayor of Daly City, the Honorable Juslyn Manalo.



Spotlighting the Work of Meals on Wheels

As a church that endeavors to stay true to its commitment to be a Matthew 25 church, our support of the Meals on Wheels program highlights that commitment. Meet one of our mission partners, Meals on Wheels.

The Meals on Wheels is a nationwide program that was founded over 50 years ago. The program delivers a hot meal to the home of persons aged 60 or over who are homebound and unable to shop and prepare their own meals and has no one to assist them. Did you know that there are an estimated 2.5 million seniors who are not receiving the services they need? In addition, Meals on Wheels also deliver a hot meal to the home of disabled individuals who are within the ages of 18-59.

There are new studies that have shown the positive impacts that Meals on Wheels has in

people's lives. This program serves as a lifeline to those struggling with food insecurity, nutrition challenges, mobility, loneliness and countless other difficulties of aging or disability. The delivery of a nutritious meal creates the opportunity to build a relationship with the individual senior, opening the door for Meals on Wheels providers to identify and deliver valuable services that promote independence and well-being.

It's amazing to think that our donations, along with others throughout our community, makes a positive difference in people's lives. Now that's living up to being a Matthew 25 church.


